HOW WE WORK

From the first conversation to the final installation, we work closely with the project team to turn ideas into bespoke woven elements.

1 DIALOGUE

Understanding the project, its context, requirements and design intent.



2 MATERIAL & WEAVE DEVELOPMENT

Exploring materials and developing woven solutions in response to the project.



3 HANDCRAFTED PRODUCTION

Transforming the developed solution into a handcrafted element, controlling materials, form and detail.



4 PROJECT SUPPORT

Supporting the final delivery and installation of the woven elements as part of the project.

MONCLER SEA RESORT

MATERIAL EXPLORATION

Exploring the potential of *corda paglia* through bespoke woven elements.



Developed in collaboration with Bertone Design for the Moncler Sea Resort project, the woven elements reinterpret *corda paglia* as a distinctive visual element. The woven elements were later applied across Moncler window installations in Cannes, Barcelona, Capri, Forte dei Marmi and Puerto Banus.

Developing woven elements in close dialogue with the interior design concept.



Working alongside Double L Studio, Intrecci Toscani developed bespoke woven elements for their interior design project in Lugano. The collaboration brought together the studio's design direction with Intrecci Toscani's expertise in materials and hand-weaving to develop solutions tailored to the space.

MAKING IDEAS TANGIBLE

Translating a cultural concept into handcrafted woven pieces.



Commissioned by Gran Teatro Puccini and developed by Gumdesign for the centenary of Turandot, the project brought together artisans working across different materials and disciplines. Intrecci Toscani contributed a series of handcrafted woven pieces to the exhibition, translating the project's cultural vision into tangible forms through material exploration, weaving and craftsmanship.
